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## **Director's Message**

We are happy to share the Annual Impact Report of 2022-2023 of Empowering Minds. The year was full of challenges for the organisation on all levels. The aftermath of pandemic has impacted the organisation and its beneficiaries immensely. At the beginning of the year the beneficiaries have not returned from their villages as their parents have lost their jobs and where not able to sustain the city lives for the whole family. Some of the activities have to be suspended as one of our partners decided to focus on some other thematic areas than education. With diligent planning and hard work of team Empowering Minds, staff and volunteers, all the activities were back on track and the same momentum was achieved by the end of first quarter. Mission Every Girl in School Program got many girls enrolled in schools and colleges in Ghaziabad and Delhi. They were provided support materials for them in continuing education.

The outreach volunteers continued with the awareness about the handwashing, sanitation, health and hygiene among the families by regular household visits and workshops at different intervals with families and communities. Distribution of Rations and Sanitation Kits in the different communities was continued too, as people were gradually moving towards normalcy and seek livelihood.

We partnered with various organisations, associations and groups to impart regular online classes for English and maths for our students. The assessment of the online classes was done at various intervals by the faculty and conducted the physical examinations. Online webinars, talks and workshops were conducted with both national and international organisations which was well received by the audience.

Empower Women, the vocational and soft - skill development program gave many girls the opportunity to learn and if needed earn for themselves. Training workshops on health, hygiene and sanitation were conducted with the resource persons who made them aware about the schemes available with the government which was followed by the workshops on Mensuration hygiene and distribution of Sanitary Napkins in the community.

Interns from different Institutes were the extended hands to the organisation. They not only took online classes for kids this year but also conducted online fund raiser for the Sanitary napkins. The interns came from Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies, Mumbai, Symbiosis Institute of Management, Noida and IMT Ghaziabad.

The board members, ground and operational Team of Empowering Minds, supported and guided the beneficiaries to provide them support wherever they needed the most. The work got media attention and was widely covered in newspapers. I take this opportunity to thank one and all for believing in us in transforming lives and impacting social change in society.

## **EMPOWER YOUNG MINDS: EDUCATION PROGRAM**

Empowering Minds runs a Non-Formal Education Centre to imparts quality education to the kids coming from the migrant community of Sanjay Colony, Arthala, an urban slum near Mohan Nagar, Ghaziabad. The Centre has an objective to provide primary education to children who lie in the age group of 4 to 14 years. It focuses on getting out the best from the children and nurturing their abilities through remedial methods of teaching. The centre follows all aspects of student development which covers scholastic, co-curricular and personality development.

During the 2022-23 academic year 89 children were mainstreamed with the Government schools and other private schools in the neighborhood.

Where the emphasis is more on enrollment of out of school/drop out children, it is heartening to see that more girls are enrolled than boys in the centre. This indicates that parents are being aware to send their girl child for education.

#### **Teaching Learning Activities**

Children returned for proper school program to the centre and full offline classes were resumed.

Along with the regular school **400 online sessions** including daily English classes from standard II to V were was held, so that the students. These were online classes on Zoom and

Google Meet. E-learning – through the Tablet and specialized Educational Program with animated stories, math and English classes were held in a fun manner.

#### **Celebrations and Events**

Due to pandemic most of the celebrations were either done online or in the fore walls of the home. However, this reporting year Children, teachers, staff and community all were enthusiastic in celebrating the festivals and different occasion face to face. Children enjoyed and participated fully in the events.









## **Sports Day**

Living by the principle of 'A healthy mind resides in a healthy body' an annual sports day is conducted for the students. Students of all grades take part in the event. This year the sports day had a plethora of activities and was conducted on 22nd February. The junior

standards participated in a sprint race, while for the senior classes, there were options of Lemon race, sack race, 3- legged race, Kho-Kho and musical chairs. The event was a great motivation for the students as officers from Provincial Armed Constabulary addressed the students and felicitated the students who secured medals in the events. The choice was made keeping in mind the aspirations of the



majority of the students at the centre. The officers were kind enough to indulge in a Tug of war event with the teachers at the school, including the interns. The event was made successful with background work that lasted for a week. The arrangement of the sports ground, racing lanes, required equipment etc. was made possible with the help of teachers at the facility. In the end, the students were given refreshments and the event culminated with motivated students, ready to compete year after year.







#### **Christmas Celebration and Sweater Distribution**

This year Christmas was celebrated with the Columbus Integration Services Pvt Ltd who came as secret Santa and distributed sweaters to children along with many other goodies. Children were very happy and enjoyed with the employees of the company and its director Mr Abhishek Asthana. Children decorated the Centre with the stories of the Christmas festival and presented songs and plays around the theme.



**Life Skills and Self - Help Skills for Children through creative movement.** Life Skills Workshop was organized for children from 24-25 July, 2022. Children were divided in to small batches and the focus of life skills training was conducted accordingly. The training was facilitated by Ms Oditi Diwedi. The age groups were divided as follows:

Age groups -

1. Batch 1: 4-6 year old

Life Skills focused on: Creative Thinking, Resilience, and Empathy

2. Batch 2: 7-9 year old

Life Skills focused on: Communication Skills, Team work & Cooperation, and Empathy

3. Batch 3: 10-12 year old

Life Skills focused on: Critical Thinking, Problem Solving Skills, and Empathy

4. Batch 4: 13-15 year old

Life Skills focused on: Self Awareness, Interpersonal Skills, and Empathy







## **NUTRITION PROGRAM**

Under our School Health program, a regular health check-up of children and teachers are carried out. The quarterly health check-up is conducted by Dr. Mita Chakorborty who does the thorough checkups of school children, staff and community women. She found that the children's health has been better due to the nutrition program. Education sessions with the parents and awareness rallies in the community all has contributed at the same time.

Awareness Sessions: The nutritional awareness activity was conducted on 29<sup>th</sup> April 22 at Empowering Minds Education Centre, situated in Sanjay Colony Ghaziabad. This was the full day activities-based workshop divided by age groups and two sessions. The first session started with the talk, PPT presentation and video on 'Nutrition and Good Health'. The Nutritionist Mrs. Manjari Gupta Purwar, explained in a very easy language the metabolism, food journey in the body, gut health, healthy food items vs junk food items etc. This session was mostly focused on the Green vegetables and fruits. It was an interactive session and the children participated actively asking questions and answering the quiz which was meant for them. Each right answer was given Biscuits, Fruity, Cake and Milk for reinforcement. The children were also asked the properties of the items which are distributed to them on daily basis and what nutrition they get out of it.

The second session was taken by Dr Meeta Chakraborty. She explained the children in groups about how to keep their body healthy and safe. She then checked each child thoroughly and provided consultancy to their parents for following the prescription.





Rallies on Nutrition Awareness: The community to which the students of the centre belong is drawn towards unhealthy eating habits. Their work schedule as well as lack of knowledge translates into a growing number of cases of Diabetes, strokes etc. This leads to more vulnerability for the students who often end up skipping classes to look after the house. Empowering Minds believes in the holistic upliftment of students and also aims to educate the community about issues like Nutrition, Education etc. Carrying on to the tradition, we prepared the students for conducting a rally on Nutrition. The students were also

introduced to the nutrition profile of easily available fruits, vegetables, cereals and junk foods. For the rally, the interns and the teachers helped the students in making posters and recite slogans.

The two slogans that were picked up for the rally were-

- Vahi bacchey safal ho payege, jo ghar ka poshtik khaana khayege (only the students who eat healthily will see success)
- Kadam Kadam badhaye jaa, junk food bhagaye ja (Take each step to avoid junk food) The preparations went on for 2 days and the rally took place for 30 minutes. The event was able to garner attention as people walked to the students to enquire about the messages.





#### **EMPOWER WOMEN:**



Mission Every Girl in School: The pandemic aftermath was that many children were dropped out of education and have gone to their villages due to their parents' loss of livelihood. Such children specially the secondary school going Girls who were dropped out are covered under this program. They were motivated and re-enrolled in the schools. They were supported with course materials, stationaries, notebooks etc.

#### **Menstruation Hygiene Program**

The community women are often unaware about the health and hygiene issues and when it comes to their personal health and hygiene that is all the more neglected. The mother and other women coming to the centre when asked about their personal health and hygiene they are found speechless and defensive. Therefore, the Menstruation health and hygiene workshops are regularly conducted with the community women and sanitary pads are provided.

### **Vocational And Soft Skill Training**

The program is implemented with the help of 2-3 instructors who are from

the community itself. The materials are sourced from the community so that the ultimate benefit goes to the residents of the area. The girls and women are taught three courses **Cutting and Tailoring, computers and Beauty Culture and Wellness.** The centre provides life skill training to adolescent girls and young women. We teach them the employability skills like beauty care, stitching and tailoring. They often use these skills to raise money, to help their families or simply apply these skills to their work. They often utilize these skills to earn money, to support their families or simply add these skills to use as and when required.
